Day 1 | Friday, June 18 | Arrive Ljubljana, Slovenia, transfer to Bled

Prepare to be enchanted by Bled's emerald lake and tiny magical island in the heart of the Julian Alps.



Day 2 | Saturday, June 19 | Bled (Ljubljana), Slovenia

Ljubljana, considered Europe's greenest capital, might well be the most charming city you'll ever visit. Our tour includes the mighty 12th century fortress that stands proudly atop Castle Hill, and a reenactment of events that shaped the city's history.

Day 3 | Sunday, June 20 | Bled (Bohinj, Radovljica), Slovenia

The Alpine Dairy Museum offers insight into the importance and endurance of pastoral life. After a traditional farmer's lunch, proceed to Radovljica, Šivec House and the Apiculture Museum.

Day 4 | Monday, June 21 | Bled → Portorož, Slovenia

Explore the medieval village of Štanjel, a place of strategic and cultural importance dating back to the Iron Age. Stroll through the beautiful Ferrari Gardens, a masterpiece of landscape design overlooking the Karst countryside. Continue to Pršutarna Ščuka to learn about the traditional Karst method of curing prosciutto. In the afternoon, travel onward to the elegant seaside town of Portorož.



Day 5 | Tuesday, June 22 | Portorož, Slovenia

Salt has been mined in Sečovelje since the Middle Ages, and traditional methods still account for its exceptional taste. Visit the salt pans and museum dedicated to preserving the fascinating history and heritage of this precious commodity. End the day at Lipica, home of the majestic Lipizzan horses, with a tour of the stables and presentation of the classical riding school.



Day 6 | Wednesday, June 23 | Portorož, Slovenia

Postojna Cave is an enchantment of tunnels, passageways and karst formations that will leave you speechless. You won't want to leave, but we must, to explore Predjama Castle, a fairytale world where human ingenuity meets nature's wonders. Perched atop a towering cliff, it was the magnificent, defiant, intriguing site of Erasmus, legendary 15th century robber baron.

Day 7 | Thursday, June 24 | Portorož, Slovenia → Plitvice, Croatia

Travel to Plitvice, which is the very essence of tranquility, and a refuge for anyone seeking a deep connection to nature. It's hard to conjure anything more wondrous than 16 terraced lakes joined by waterfalls, flowing into a limestone canyon. This photo enthusiast's dream is described as "the most laughing and light-minded of natural prodigies."

Day 8 | Friday, June 25 | Plitvice → Split, Croatia

Split was the 4th century holiday home of Roman Emperor Diocletian. With Roman ruins and grand museums juxtaposed with trendy shops and cafes, this city has it all. It is overflowing with rich history and a storied past that have left traces in everyday life.

Day 9 | Saturday, June 26 | Split, Croatia

This morning we immerse ourselves in antiquity and explore the most significant sites. This afternoon we visit a gallery that features the most important work of renowned sculptor Ivan Meštrović.

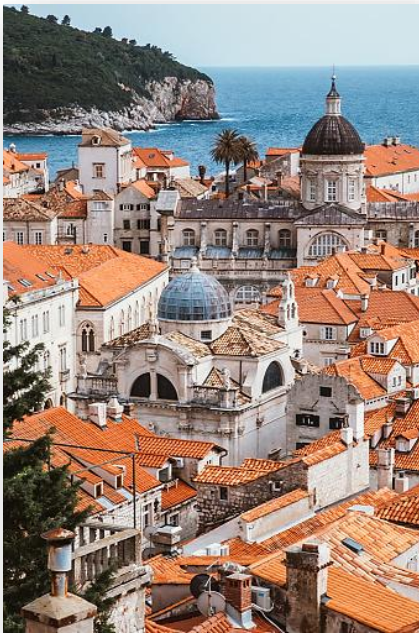
Day 10 | Sunday, June 27 | Split (Hvar & Stari Grad), Croatia

Board a catamaran and set sail for Hvar Island. The serenity belies the brutal 16th century uprising against Venetian nobility. Continue to the UNESCO town of Stari Grad, founded by Greeks in 384 BC.



Day 11 | Monday, June 28 | Split → Dubrovnik, Croatia

Drive the stunning Adriatic Coast to Dubrovnik.



Day 12 | Tuesday, June 29 | Dubrovnik, Croatia

Dubrovnik reveals the genius of history's architectural masters. Its ramparts and fortresses are enduring monuments to emperors and legends, and speak softly of a bygone era.

Day 13 | Wednesday, June 30 | Dubrovnik, Croatia (Elaphiti)

Timeless guardians of the coast and sea, the Elaphiti Islands have been home to generations of sailors. Our full day excursion is by private boat.

Day 14 | Thursday, July 1 | Departure
